

**THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SEGUIN**

**BY-LAW NUMBER 2024-016**

**BEING A BY-LAW TO REGULATE AND GOVERN THE USE OF AND ACTIVITIES PERMITTED  
WITHIN TOWNSHIP PARKS AND OPEN SPACE AND TO REPEAL BY-LAW 2005-053 AND ALL  
OF ITS AMENDING BY-LAWS IN THEIR ENTIRETY**

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**WHEREAS** Sections 8, 9 and 10 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, authorize the Township of Seguin to pass by-laws necessary or desirable for municipal purposes, and authorize by laws respecting the economic, social and environmental well-being of the municipality; the health, safety and well-being of persons; the protection of persons and property; and Animals;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 10 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, authorizes a municipality to pass by-laws respecting matters within spheres of jurisdiction including culture, parks, recreation and heritage;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 23.1 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, authorizes a municipality to delegate its powers and duties to a person;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 128 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, provides that, without limiting Sections 9 and 11, a local municipality may prohibit and regulate with respect to public nuisances, including matters that, in the opinion of Council, are or could become or cause public nuisances;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 425 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, provides that any person who contravenes any by-law of the municipality is guilty of an offence;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 444 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, provides that a municipality may make and order to require a person to discontinue contravening a by-law and to do the work required to correct the contravention;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 446 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, provides that a municipality may proceed to do things at a person's expense which that person is otherwise required to do under a by-law but has failed to do and the costs incurred by a municipality may be recovered by adding the costs to the tax roll and collecting them in the same manner as property taxes;

**AND WHEREAS** Subsection 128(2) of the *Highway Traffic Act, R.S.O. 1990, c. H-8 (HTA)*, as amended, provides that a municipality may pass by-laws prescribing a rate of speed different from the rate set out in Subsection (1) of the HTA that is not greater than 100km per hour and may prescribe different rates of speed for different times of day;

**AND WHEREAS**, Council deems it appropriate to enact a by-law to provide for the maintenance, operation, management and regulation of municipal parks and open spaces;

**NOW THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SEGUIN  
HEREBY ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:**

**1. SHORT TITLE**

1.1 This By-law may be cited as the "Public Parks and Open Spaces By-law".

**2. DEFINITIONS**

In this By-law, the following terms shall have the following meanings:

- 2.1 "Animal" shall mean any member of the animal kingdom, other than a human;
- 2.2 "Authorized Sign" means any sign, notice, or other device placed or erected in or upon a Park by the Township;
- 2.3 "Bicycle" means a Power Assisted Bicycle or any cycle propelled or driven by muscular power and equipped with an alarm bell, gong or horn, regardless of the number of wheels it has, but does not include a Motor Assisted Bicycle;
- 2.4 "Boat" means any vessel which floats on the surface of the water and is capable of carrying people or material whether motorized or not and includes but is not limited to pleasure crafts, scows, personal watercrafts, canoes, row Boats, pontoon Boats, float planes when on water or land, and Boats used in commercial operations;
- 2.5 "Council" shall mean the Council of The Corporation of the Township of Seguin;
- 2.6 "Designated Area" means an area of a Park designated by the Director for a specific purpose or use;
- 2.7 "Domesticated Animal" is an Animal kept by a Person for pleasure or companionship, excluding Livestock;
- 2.8 "Director" means the Director of Community Services of the Township of Seguin, or their designate;
- 2.9 "Drone" means a remotely piloted aircraft system (RPAS) that has a set of configurable elements consisting of a remotely piloted aircraft, its control station, the command and control links, and any other system elements required during flight operation, as defined by the Canadian Aviation Regulations, as amended;
- 2.10 "Livestock" shall mean a farm Animal that is usually kept by a Person for Animal husbandry, or for its pelt, wool or fur, or for food or research purposes, and includes horses, cows, pigs, goats and sheep, but does not include a dog or cat;
- 2.11 "Motor Assisted Bicycle" means a Motor Assisted Bicycle as defined in the Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, c.H.8, as amended;

- 2.12 “Motorized Recreational Vehicle” means a Motor Vehicle that is:
- (a) an Off-Road Vehicle as defined in the Off-Road Vehicles Act; or
  - (b) the following as defined in Regulation 316/03:
    - i) an All-Terrain Vehicle,
    - ii) an Extreme Terrain Vehicle,
    - iii) a Multi-purpose Off-Highway Utility Vehicle,
    - iv) an Off-Road Motorcycle,
    - v) a Recreational Off-Highway Vehicle;
- 2.13 “Motor Vehicle” means a Motor Vehicle as defined in the Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, c.H.8, as amended;
- 2.14 “Municipal Act, 2001” means the *Municipal Act, 2001*, S.O. 2001, c. 25, as amended;
- 2.15 “Officer” means any Person authorized by the Township to enforce this By-law or to carry out inspections in relation to this By-law, and includes a Municipal Law Enforcement Officer or a police officer;
- 2.16 “Open Air Fire” means an Open Air Fire as defined in the Township’s Open Air Buring By-law, as amended from time to time;
- 2.17 “Park” means any land or premises including any body of water, or Recreational Trail and any buildings, structures, improvements, or equipment, located thereon, that is owned by or under the control of the Township by lease, agreement, or otherwise, and that is established, dedicated, set apart or made available for use as public open space and without limiting the foregoing includes any such parcels of land so designated by the Township as set out in Schedule “B”, but does not include a cemetery;
- 2.18 “Parking Area” means a part of a Park that is designated for the parking of Vehicles;
- 2.19 “Parks Staff” means any employee of the Township’s Community Services department;
- 2.20 “Permit” means written permission or written authorization issued by the Director or designate under this By-law, issued for the temporary use or access to a Park which shall include, but not limited to, a permit for temporary access, material storage, temporarily encroach, to conduct a specific activity that is otherwise not permitted and to conduct a Special Event;

- 2.21 "Person" means an individual, partnership, association, firm or corporation, and in the case of a minor, the person having custody of the minor;
- 2.22 "Recreational Trail" means a multi-purpose path whether paved or unpaved but does not include a Roadway or Parking Area;
- 2.23 "Roadway" means a road that has been designed and is intended for motor vehicle traffic and expressly excludes a Recreational Trail;
- 2.24 "Sell" includes display for sale, expose for sale, and offer for sale;
- 2.25 "Smoking" includes the smoking or holding of lighted tobacco, lighted cannabis, or any substance used for smoking, and Smoke has a corresponding meaning;
- 2.26 "Motorized Snow Vehicle" means a motorized snow vehicle as defined in the Highway Traffic Act R.S.O. 1990, c.H.8, as amended;
- 2.27 "Special Event" means an event which is being held either as a community, social, sporting, family, or cultural group celebration, or other similar event that requires additional permission from Township Community Services or other internal or external departments in order to proceed;
- 2.28 "Sports Amenities" means any Park Amenity designed for sports including, but not limited to, soccer fields, baseball fields, football fields, cricket pitches, pickleball courts, basketball courts, tennis courts, volleyball courts, and playgrounds;
- 2.29 "Township" means The Corporation of the Township of Seguin;
- 2.30 "Township Staff" means any employee of the Township;
- 2.31 "Vaping" means the inhaling or exhaling of vapour from an inhalant-type device of any substance, or the holding of an activated inhalant-type device, and Vape has a corresponding meaning;
- 2.32 "Vehicle" means and includes a/an Motor Vehicle, Motor Assisted Bicycle, e-scooter, traction engine, farm implement or equipment, motorized construction equipment, Motorized Snow Vehicle, aeroplane, trailer or any other vehicle which is capable of being driven, propelled, or drawn by any kind of combustible, motorized, battery, solar or electric power, but does not include a motorized wheelchair or other accessibility devices.

### 3. SCOPE

- 3.1 This By-law shall apply to all Parks in the Township, subject to Section 3.2.
- 3.2 The following sections of this By-law shall not apply to the Rose Point Trail:
  - (a) 7.1 (Hours);

- (b) 8.1 (Park Entry Prohibitions); and
- (c) 9.1(k) (Operation of Vehicles/Motorized Conveyances).

#### **4. ADMINISTRATION**

- 4.1 The Director shall be responsible for the administration of this By-law.
- 4.2 As part of its responsibility to administer this By-law, the Director, or their designate, may:
  - (a) Identify and/or mark Designated Areas within a Park;
  - (b) make regulations and/or rules upon which a Designated Area shall be used, including without limitation regulations excluding public access without a Permit;
  - (c) make regulations and/or rules for the orderly use of a Park and any Park facilities;
  - (d) issue Permits, subject to conditions, for specific uses of a Park or parts of a Park;
  - (e) revoke a Permit as a result of a breach of:
    - i) a condition of the Permit, or
    - ii) any Regulations and/or Rules; or
    - iii) a provision of this By-law.

#### **5. EXEMPTIONS**

- 5.1 This By-law shall not apply to:
  - (a) Employees or agents of any Emergency Service Provider (ambulance, police and fire services) while acting in the scope of their duties while in the Park;
  - (b) The Vehicles and other properties of any Emergency Service Provider while being used in connection with or as a consequence of the provision of emergency services;
  - (c) The Township, its Vehicles and Boats, and its employees or agents acting within the scope of their duties as employees or agents of the Township;
- 5.2 The Director may exempt Persons from all or part of the requirements and prohibitions of this By-law from time to time if such exemption is required for the beneficial administration of a Park.

## **6. PERMITS**

- 6.1** An applicant for a Permit under this By-law shall:
- (a)** Complete an application for the Permit on the forms as provided by the Director.
  - (b)** Submit a completed application together with the applicable fees as set out in Schedule "A" of this By-law, which may include a security deposit.
  - (c)** Provide any documentation and insurance certificates as required by the Director or Parks Staff as prerequisites and requirements for the issuance of the Permit.
- 6.2** A permit holder shall comply or ensure the compliance of all the provisions and conditions of the Permit and this By-law.
- 6.3** Failure to comply with any provision or condition of a Permit or this By-law may result in the revocation of the Permit by the Director or designate, in addition to any other enforcement proceedings against the permit holder as permitted by law.
- 6.4** The permit holder of a revoked Permit shall immediately cease or ensure the immediate cessation of all the activities for which a Permit has been issued upon revocation of the Permit.
- 6.5** Where a permit holder has damaged any Park property, including but not limited to, landscaping, Trees or Park Amenities, the permit holder may be ordered to:
- (a)** compensate for the damage to the satisfaction of the Township at the expense of the permit holder; and/or
  - (b)** compensate for any studies or documentation, as deemed appropriate by Parks Staff, to determine the extent of the damage before repairing the damage.
- 6.6** If the permit holder fails to comply with an order made under Section 6.5 or if the Township chooses to correct the damage itself, the Township may correct the damage and use any security deposit posted by the permit holder to pay for any costs associated with carrying out the work.
- 6.7** If the costs incurred by the Township in carrying out any work under Section 6.6 are greater than the security deposit posted by the permit holder, any costs not covered by the security deposit shall be a debt owed by the permit holder to the Township and the Township may recover the costs of carrying out the work from

the permit holder or add the costs to the tax roll of the property in question and collect them in the same manner as property taxes.

- 6.8 Failure to abide by the Permit, may result in restricted access to and/or a denial of any future request for a Permit.
- 6.9 The issuance of a Permit under this By-law does not relieve any Person from the necessity of acquiring any other license or permit required for carrying on an activity in a Park under any other applicable laws, By-laws, regulations, and requirements of other governmental authority.
- 6.10 A Permit is the property of the Township and is not transferable.

## **7. HOURS**

- 7.1 All Parks shall close at 11:00 pm and shall remain closed until 6:00 am the following day, unless otherwise posted at the entrances or access points of the applicable Park, or specified in this By-law.
- 7.2 Notwithstanding Sections 7.1 of this By-law, the Director or Officer may close a Park or a portion of a Park for a period of time, where the Director or Officer determines that it is necessary:
  - (a) to maintain the safety or security of the Park; or
  - (b) to conduct an investigation; or
  - (c) to allow the Director or Officer to adequately administer and enforce this By-law; or
  - (d) for the beneficial administration of the Park or to carry out the functions as authorized by a Permit for use of the Park or part of the Park.

## **8. PARK ENTRY PROHIBITIONS**

- 8.1 No Person shall:
  - (a) enter or remain in a Park after it has been closed, unless otherwise authorized under a Permit or Section 5.2 of this By-law; or
  - (b) enter or remain in an area of a Park where admission is prohibited or restricted without a Permit; or
  - (c) enter or access through a Park for the purpose of conducting any work on private property or Park property without a Permit.

## **9. GENERAL PROHIBITIONS**

- 9.1 While in a Park, no Person shall:

- (a) engage in riotous, boisterous, violent, threatening, or illegal activity, or use profane or abusive language, which includes hatred against an identifiable group; or
- (b) engage in any activity that, if in the opinion of Parks Staff or Officers, creates a nuisance or that interferes with the use and enjoyment of the Park by other Persons; or
- (c) engage in any activity that may cause injury or damage to the Park, any Person, Animal or vegetation therein; or
- (d) disobey an Authorized Sign; or
- (e) operate any remote-controlled or other powered devices, including but not limited to, model versions of an aircraft, rocket, watercraft, Drones and vehicles, except in a Designated Area for such use, unless authorized by Permit; or
- (f) golf; or
- (g) use a skateboard or rollerblades if prohibited as marked by an Authorized Sign; or
- (h) release any balloons; or
- (i) erect, place, install, or cause the erection, placing or installation of any permanent or temporary structure, tent or booth without a Permit; or
- (j) camp, erect or place a tent for shelter or temporary abode of any kind unless authorized by the Director; or
- (k) operate any Vehicle or any other form of motorized conveyances on a Recreational Trail; or
- (l) be in possession of or use a firearm, air gun, cross bow, bow and arrow, axe, paint guns or any similar weapon of any kind unless authorized by Permit; or
- (m) urinate or defecate except in a designated washroom; or
- (n) cause to take place or participate in a marriage ceremony except in a Designated Area for such use, unless authorized by Permit; or
- (o) enter or attempt to enter any area locked or otherwise restricted from public access; or
- (p) possess, consume, serve or Sell alcoholic beverages unless authorized by a Permit,



- (q) Smoke or Vape, regardless of the absence of an Authorized Sign prohibiting Smoking or Vaping.

9.2 While in a Park, no Person shall:

- (a) bury, scatter, or otherwise dispose of any biological or cremated remains; or
- (b) cause to take place or participate in a funeral service unless authorized by a Permit.

9.3 No Person shall dump, deposit, drain, or otherwise dispose of:

- (a) any snow, fill, soil, construction materials or any other material or substance in a Park unless authorized by a Permit; or
- (b) any waste anywhere in the Park, except waste generated from and during the use of the Park and wholly into receptacles where provided in the Park for such purposes;
- (c) discharge of water or wastewater from sewage, any roof drainage system, hot tub, swimming pool, or pond into or onto a Park.

9.4 No Person shall encroach upon or take possession of any Park property by any means whatsoever, including but not limited to the construction, installation, placement or maintenance of any object on Park property.

## 10. DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

10.1 While in a Park, no Person shall:

- (a) plant, prune, remove or damage any vegetation unless otherwise authorized by a Permit; or
- (b) climb anything unless the thing or object is designated for climbing; or
- (c) remove, deface, disturb or damage any building, object, amenity, soil, sand, gravel, stone or any other material located in the Park.

## 11. CAMPFIRE

11.1 While in a Park, no Person shall:

- (a) light, build or stoke a Open Air Fire unless authorized by a Permit.

## 12. SPECIAL EVENTS

12.1 No Person shall in a Park:

- (a) hold a Special Event for more than twenty-five (25) persons without a Permit; or

- (b) interfere with a Special Event authorized by Permit; or
- (c) move equipment, seats, tables, benches etc. from an area to another area to accommodate the Special Event unless authorized by Permit.

### **13. AMPLIFIERS AND SPEAKERS**

- 13.1 While in a Park, no Person shall operate or use any sound amplifying equipment, in a manner that, in the opinion of a Township Staff or an Officer, disturbs or interferes with other persons in or near the Park, unless authorized under a Permit and in accordance with the provisions of the Township's Noise By-law.

### **14. CIRCULARS AND ADVERTISEMENTS**

- 14.1 While in a Park, no Person shall distribute, post, or display any handbill, notice, or any other type of circulars, bills, advertisements, or any form of promotional item or samples unless authorized by a Permit and subject to Section 14.2.
- 14.2 Section 14.1 shall not apply to advertisements no larger than eight and a half (8 ½) inches by eleven (11) inches in diameter posted on Township-designated advertisement boards where an Authorized Sign indicates such activities are permitted.

### **15. COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES**

- 15.1 No Person shall practice, carry on, conduct, undertake any commercial activity, including the selling of wares or services, or conduct any business trade, in a Park unless authorized by a Permit.

### **16. ANIMALS IN PARKS**

- 16.1 In addition to any other provision of this By-law, Animals in Parks shall be subject to the Township's Animal Control By-law.
- 16.2 No Person shall:
- (a) bring any Animal other than a Domesticated Animal into a Park unless authorized by a Permit: or
  - (b) allow an Animal to enter any beach, swimming area, or any other area posted to prohibit the Animal within a Park; or
  - (c) notwithstanding Subsection (a), bring into or ride a horse in a Park; or
  - (d) fail to remove excrement left by the Animal.
- 16.3 Subsection 16.2 of this By-law does not apply to a service Animal where it is being used to aid a person with a visual, hearing or other impediment.

## **17. PROTECTION OF WILDLIFE**

**17.1** No Person, while in a Park, shall:

- (a) kill, attempt to kill, hunt, trap, or otherwise pursue an Animal in any manner so as to disturb its presence in the Park, except for fishing in accordance with the *Fish and Wildlife Conservation Act, 1997* and the regulations enacted thereunder; or
- (b) feed any Animal or leave food or attractants of any type or in any; or
- (c) allow an Animal to disturb any wildlife or vegetation; or
- (d) dump or dispose of any Animal (living or dead).

## **18. VEHICLES, ROADWAYS AND PARKING AREAS**

**18.1** Unless otherwise permitted, no Person shall drive, operate, pull, or ride any Vehicle in a Park except on a Roadway or Parking Area.

**18.2** Unless otherwise permitted, no Person shall allow another person to drive, operate, pull, or ride any Vehicle that is in their care or possession in a Park except on a Roadway or Parking Area.

**18.3** No Person shall use a Roadway or Parking Area in a Park for:

- (a) washing, cleaning, servicing, maintaining or the repair of a Vehicle, except in the case of an emergency; or
- (b) games or sport activities.

**18.4** No Person shall park any Vehicle in a Parking Area except while using the Park during Park hours, in accordance with Section 7.1 of this By-law, unless authorized by a Permit.

**18.5** No Person shall park a school bus in a Park except for the purpose of pick-up and drop-off, and in any event, no Person shall park a school bus for that purpose for more than 30 minutes.

**18.6** Township Staff or an Officer may direct vehicular or pedestrian traffic at their discretion where it is considered reasonably necessary to ensure the orderly movement of traffic, or to permit action in an emergency.

## **19. SPEED**

**19.1** No Person shall operate a Vehicle on a Roadway in a park in excess of the posted limit.

- 19.2 No Person shall operate a Vehicle on any Roadway in a Park at a speed exceeding twenty-five (25) kilometers per hour, unless otherwise posted.

## 20. ENFORCEMENT

- 20.1 Township Staff or an Officer may order any Person believed to be contravening or have contravened any provision of this By-law:
- (a) to immediately cease and desist from the activity constituting or contributing to such contravention; or
  - (b) to immediately remove from the Park any Animal or thing owned by or in the control of such Person which is involved in such contravention; or
  - (c) to leave the Park immediately.
- 20.2 No Person shall knowingly provide any false information in any statement, whether in writing or otherwise, made to an Officer investigating an offence under this By-law.
- 20.3 Where an Officer believes that any Person has committed or is committing an offence under this By-law, the Officer may require the name, address and proof of identity of that Person, and the Person shall supply the required information.
- 20.4 Township Staff or an Officer may order any Person engaging in an activity that requires a Permit under this By-law to provide the original copy of the Permit for inspection.
- 20.5 No Person shall fail to comply with an order given by Township Staff or an Officer.
- 20.6 No Person shall hinder or obstruct, or attempt to hinder or obstruct, any Officer exercising a power or performing a duty under this By-law. Any Person who is alleged to have contravened any of the provisions of this By-law shall identify themselves to the Officer upon request, failure to do so shall be deemed to have obstructed or hindered the Officer in the execution of his duties.

## 21. PENALTIES

- 21.1 Every Person who contravenes any provision of this By-law, including failing to comply with an order made under this By-law, is guilty of an offence and is liable to a fine as provided for in the *Provincial Offences Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P.33, as amended (the "Provincial Offences Act").
- 21.2 In addition to Subsection 21.1 of this By-law, any Person who is charged with an offence under this By-law by the laying of an information under Part III of the *Provincial Offences Act*, R.S.O. 1990, c. P-33, as amended is found guilty of the offence is liable:

- (a) on a first conviction to a fine of not more than \$15,000.00; and
- (b) on any subsequent conviction to a fine of not more than \$30,000.00.

21.3 If a Person is convicted of an offence under this By-law, in addition to any other remedy or any penalty imposed, the court in which the conviction has been entered, and any court of competent jurisdiction, may make an order:

- (a) prohibiting the continuation or repetition of the offence by the Person convicted; and
- (b) requiring the Person convicted to correct the contravention in the manner and within the period that the court considers appropriate.

## **22. CONFLICT**

22.1 In the event of any conflict between this By-law and the Township's Animal Control By-law, as amended from time to time, the Animal Control By-law shall take precedence.

## **23. INTERPRETATION**

23.1 Wherever a word is used in this By-law with its first letter capitalized, the term is being used as it is defined in Section 2 of this By-law. Where any word appears in ordinary case, the commonly applied English language meaning is intended.

23.2 Wherever a word defined in Section 2 of this By-law is used in the form of a noun, verb, adverb, or adjective, it shall be interpreted as having a corresponding defined meaning even if it is in ordinary case.

23.3 All words importing the singular shall include the plural, and words importing the masculine gender shall include the feminine, and the converse of the foregoing also applies, unless the context of the By-law requires otherwise.

## **24. SEVERABILITY**

24.1 Should any section, clause or provision of this By-law be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the By-law as a whole or any part thereof, other than the part which was declared to be invalid.

## **25. ENACTMENT**

25.1 This By-law shall come into full force and effect on the date that it is passed.
