

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF SEGUIN

BY-LAW NO. 2002-11

(CONSOLIDATION as of May, 2017 - as amended by By-law Nos. 2002-25, 2003-82, 2007-078, 2010-068, 2011-059 and 2017-044)

Being a By-law to prohibit and/or regulate the disposal of waste at the Drop Off Sites, Transfer Sites and Landfill Site in the Township of Seguin and that all by-laws, or parts thereof, contrary hereto or inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, Section 208.6 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990 c.M.45 authorizes municipalities to pass by-laws to prohibit or regulate the use of any part of a waste management system within the Township of Seguin,

AND WHEREAS, the Township of Seguin wishes to pass a by-law to establish a disposal policy and user fees for all household and non-household waste at all drop off sites, transfer sites and the landfill site within the Township,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT, the Council for the Township of Seguin enacts as follows:

1. Definitions:

- a. Household waste means all waste generated within the household, and does not include bulky items such as brown goods (furnishings, carpets, mattresses, etc.) and white goods (refrigerators, stoves, washers, etc.). Household waste does not include any materials used in the construction, demolition and/or renovation of buildings and does not include recyclable material or non-collectable wastes.
- b. Untreated wood means wood that is not painted, pressure-treated, soaked with creosote or any other toxic substance.
- c. Clean construction, demolition and renovation materials means, but is not necessarily limited to, the following:
 - i) manufacturers waste including wire;
 - ii) broken plaster, lumber, rubble, shingles or other waste or residue resulting from the construction, alteration, repair, demolition or removal of any building or structure;
 - iii) stock of any wholesaler which shall be regarded as manufacturers waste;
 - iv) wire, wire mesh and fencing;
 - v) discarded plumbing sinks, toilet bowls and seals, pipe fittings and hot water tanks; and
 - vi) loose minor rubble.
- d. Brush means trees, branches, stumps and roots.
- e. Household Hazardous waste means waste generated from a dwelling and designated by Seguin Township as acceptable at a household hazardous waste depot and includes:
 - i) corrosive wastes including batteries, drain cleaners and oven cleaners;
 - ii) toxic wastes including pesticides, rat poison, pharmaceuticals and cleaning fluids;
 - iii) reactive wastes including pool chemicals, ammonia, bleach and aerosols; and
 - iv) flammable wastes including paints, solvents, oils, varnishes, stains, gasoline, kerosene and B.B.Q. starters;
 - v) distillates.
- f. Compostable material means any compostable material and includes grass cuttings garden refuse, leaves and organic kitchen waste.
- g. Recyclable material means all material designated as recyclable by Seguin Township and includes, but is not limited to, glass bottles, cans, assorted plastics, cardboard and newsprint.
- h. Industrial Commercial and Institutional (ICI) waste means waste generated within

areas in Seguin Township that are zoned or operated for Commercial and/or Industrial and/or Institutional use, e. g., a shop, factory, store, restaurant, hotel, office building, public building, hospital and other places of business.

- i. Scrap metal means materials with metal content including appliances, aluminum siding, bed springs and metal beds and/or articles acceptable to the scrap metal program.
 - j. Transtor Site means a site location containing a number of HAUL-ALL®, 53 cu. yd., animal-proof household waste and recyclables transtor containers.
 - k. Waste Drop Off Site means a site location containing a number of HAUL-ALL®, Model HL6, animal-proof, household waste and recyclables receptacles.
 - l. Boats mean wooden, fibre glass, form of plastic under 20 feet in length with all engines, components, oil reserves and fuel tanks removed.
 - m. Special items mean items or material that are not defined in the above definitions.
- 2. Rules and Regulations Governing Disposal of Waste within the Township:**
- a. All household waste and recyclables, must be deposited only at the sites indicated on Schedule “B” of this by-law.
 - b. Bulky items, clean construction material, brush and scrap metal must be deposited only at the Christie Landfill Site and are subject to the applicable fees set out in Schedule “C”.
 - c. No person shall deposit any waste in any location within the Township of Seguin except at a waste disposal site established in accordance with this by-law.
 - d. No person shall deposit or otherwise dispose of any waste brought in from outside the Township of Seguin, upon any lands, whether publicly or privately owned, including any waste disposal site established by the Township of Seguin.
 - e. No person shall deposit or otherwise dispose of waste, as herein defined, at the landfill site except during the hours of operation.
 - f. No person shall scavenge, interfere with, remove, exchange or scatter any waste found at a waste drop off site or transtor site.
 - g. No person shall deposit or otherwise dispose of the following items anywhere within the Township of Seguin and/or at any waste drop off site, transtor site or the landfill site within Seguin Township:
 - i) household hazardous waste listed in Section 1. e., unless otherwise authorized by the Township;
 - ii) propane tanks over 20 lbs.;
 - iii) used cars or car parts;
 - iv) pathological diseased materials including syringes, bandages, poultices, dressings and any other medical waste or refuse from any medical clinic, dental clinic, veterinarian clinic, hospital or mortuary;
 - v) explosives or highly combustible materials;
 - vi) oil soaked or gasoline soaked absorbent materials such as oil filters;
 - vii) liquid waste of any kind;
 - viii) hay, straw and manure;
 - ix) carcass of any animal;
 - x) live animals or birds;
 - xi) grease trap wastes; and
 - xii) ashes which are live and warm.
 - h. No person shall deposit any waste at or near, or outside or around the waste drop off sites and/or transtor sites except in the appropriate household waste and/or recycling receptacles provided at the sites.
 - i. No person shall deposit any waste at or near, or outside or just inside the gates of the landfill site except in the appropriate household waste and/or recycling receptacles provided during the hours of operation.
 - j. No person shall deposit more than a one 1 ton truck load of construction, demolition and renovation materials for any one construction site/job at the landfill site. Any more than one 1 ton truck load for any one construction site/job and the user must make alternate arrangements for disposal through a private disposal company.

3. Additional

- a. Everyone using the landfill site must first see the attendant when entering the site. The attendant has the right to inspect all material entering the landfill site and may not accept materials that are contaminated with items not accepted at the landfill site. All materials being deposited at the landfill site must be disposed of at areas designated by the attendant.
- b. The hours of operation of the Christie Landfill Site will be established by resolution of Council from time to time.

4. Penalty and Liability for Expenses:

- a. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of the provisions of this By-law is guilty of an offence and upon conviction is liable to a fine not exceeding the maximum provided under the Provincial Offences Act, exclusive of costs, and every such fine shall be recoverable under the Provincial Offences Act.
- b. Any costs and expenses for services provided by or on behalf of the municipality, or for which the Municipality is liable in endeavoring to remove waste, garbage or other refuse caused by or resulting from a person contravening or failing to comply with any provision of this By-law shall be a service charge pursuant to Section 220.1 of the Municipal Act and shall constitute a debt of such person to the municipality. Service charges pursuant to this By-law shall be as set out in Schedule "A" to this By-law.
- c. Any service charge imposed pursuant to this By-law shall be payable within fifteen (15) days after the Municipality has delivered or sent by prepaid registered post an invoice to the person responsible, and interest shall accrue and be added to the amount at the rate established in Schedule "A" to this By-law, commencing on the 16th day following the delivery or sending of the invoice.

5. This by-law shall come into force and take effect upon third and final reading.

**Schedule “A” to By-law 2002-11
(Schedule “A” to By-law 2002-25)**

1. Service Charge

Pursuant to Section 4. b of this By-law, Service Charges shall be as follows:

\$100.00/hour, minimum charge \$100.00

2. Rate of Interest

Pursuant to Section 4. c of this By-law, the rate of 1.25% per month shall be used to calculate interest on unpaid service charges.

**Schedule “B” to By-law 2002-11

1. Household Waste and Recyclables Disposal Locations:

The following Waste Drop Off Sites accept household waste and recyclables only and are accessible 24 hours a day, 7 days a week:

Hwy 141 (2kms East of Humphrey Drive)
Highway #632 at Stanley House Road
Airport Road
Corner of Bon Echo Road and Salmon Lake Road
Brooks Road
Hwy 141 (100 m. West of Turtle Lake Road)
Depot Road- Adjacent to the Christie Landfill Site

**Schedule "C" to By-law No. 2002-11
(Schedule "A" to By-law No. 2017-044)**

Tipping Fees at the Landfill Site

All bulky items, clean construction material, and brush must be deposited at the Landfill Site located on Star Lake Road in Orrville and are subject to the following tipping fees:

Items/Materials	Fees
Scrap Metal (including appliances, stoves, dishwashers, washing machines, clothes dryers, etc.)	NO CHARGE
Refrigerant removal (refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner, etc.)	\$25.00 per unit
Electronics (TV, Computer components, fax machines, etc. See Landfill Attendant for complete list.)	NO CHARGE
Tires	NO CHARGE
Furniture, mattresses and household items (toys, textiles, etc.)	\$ 5.00 small \$ 10.00 large
Brush (small Trailer to ¾ ton truck load)	\$ 5.00 per load
Boats (maximum length 20 feet)	\$ 2.00 per foot stripped \$ 4.00 per foot as is
Clean construction, demolition and renovation material including carpet Small trailer to ½ ton truck load Large trailer to 1 ton truck	\$30.00 per load \$50.00 per load
Shingles	\$ 6.00 per bundle

Under Special Circumstances the above noted fees may be waived by the Chief Administrative Officer or the Director of Public Works.
